Elected to serve as Directors are Peggy Santoro (*Reno Gazette-Journal*), Hali Bernstein Saylor (*The Nevada Independent*) and Dana Gentry (*Nevada Current*).

Dave Mondt, *Las Vegas Sun*, continues to serve on the board with one year remaining on his current term.

“This new leadership team reflects the strength and diversity of Nevada’s press,” said Brian Allfrey, NPA Executive Director. “Their collective expertise will help us navigate the changing media landscape, advocate for press freedoms at the legislature, and expand training and support for our members.”

During the meeting, members also approved a bylaws amendment extending officer terms from one year to two years. This change aligns board leadership terms with Nevada’s biennial legislative session cycle, allowing officers more time to prepare for and work through legislative

sessions effectively. This continuity is expected to strengthen the Association's advocacy efforts and provide more stable leadership through critical policy discussions.

The Nevada Press Association looks forward to a productive year ahead, including enhanced training opportunities, improved awards program visibility, and exploration of future convention venues in Southern Nevada.
